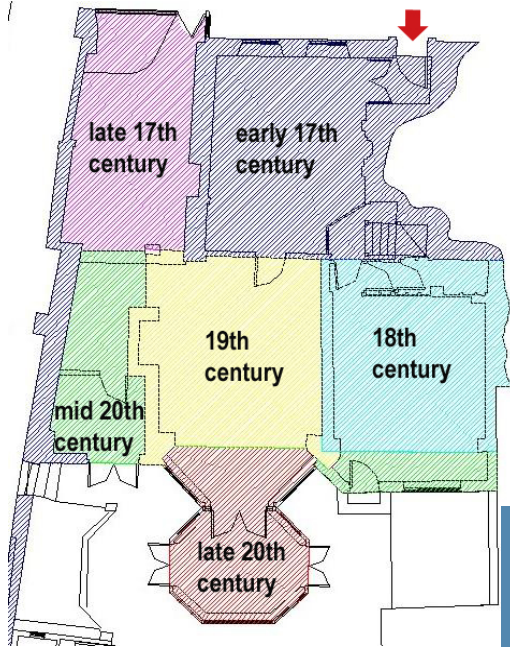


Restoration of 17th century building, Midhurst

The drawing shows the historical development of the building before work began, from 17th century cottage to ground floor shop and flat. The entrance is arrowed. The earliest parts now form a lounge and bar.

Fabric from each historic period, including fireplaces, oak timbers and the original stone and brick façade was revealed and restored. Creating a separate residential entrance, opening up and extending the ground floor and expressing the surviving features of the old house have helped to tell the story of the building while giving it a new lease of life as a restaurant and apartments.



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
